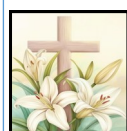
ALL Saints Day - Mass will be celebrated on **Saturday, 1st November at 9:30am only.**



All Souls Day - Mass will be celebrated on **Saturday, 1st November 5.30pm** and **Sunday, 2nd November at 8.00am & 10.00am.** You are reminded that a plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only, by visiting a Church on the 2nd of November and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Three conditions apply, Having been to confession, receiving communion, and praying for the Popes intentions.



Feast Days and Memorial Masses in November - The month of November is set aside as a special time to pray for the dead. Masses during this month will be offered for the repose of the souls of all our deceased family and friends. If you have particular people you wish to remember please complete a November mass offering envelope, available near the offertory table and place them in the box provided. Their names will be placed in the special Book of Remembrance.



Special Mass for the deceased - **Friday 7th, November at 7:00pm.** We will be holding our traditional mass in memory of those who have died during the last twelve months.

Families of those whose funeral was held at Toongabbie will be contacted by post and specially invited to this Liturgy. Special invitations will also be sent to families of past conspicuous parishioners. However, all parishioners who have lost direct family members, ie parents, brothers or sisters, grandparents, during the last twelve months, are invited to attend. If you make contact with the Parish Office their names can be added to our list and will be called out for a candle to be lit.

The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

REFLECTION

Standing in the Humus of Life

This parable begins 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray'. But only one of them actually prayed: 'God be merciful to me, a sinner'. The other informs God how well he is doing in the piety stakes. Notice that he strings together a whole lot of verbs, all in the first person singular! This means he is in mortal danger of staying in the first person singular after death, which is Hellish.

The other is said to be 'humble'. I like the English companion word: 'humus'. He is well-grounded, knows where he is standing, sometimes in the manure of life.

It takes courage and humility to admit to God exactly where we stand. We can do so in Confession, or less formally simply praying: 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner'.

We could pause for a moment to humbly pray so that we may hope to hear Our Lord say: 'This woman, this man, this boy, this girl, went home at rights with God.'


